This service also gives you a chance to remember your loved ones that have passed. Part of the service is a memorial and honors the deceased. Feel free to bring pictures of your loved ones to place on the altar during this time. This service is designed to help us all come to terms with feelings and emotions one might have during tough times, whether on a very personal or on a broader scale.

# Ministry with Children & Youth

## Coming of Age RE Program

2007-2008

We are excited to be offering the Coming of Age Program this church year as a component of our Sunday morning RE program for eighth and ninth graders. We were off to a heart-warming initiation with the Opening Coming of Age Ceremony that several UUMANS shared with us after service on Sunday, August 26<sup>th</sup>.

### What is a “Coming of Age” program?

“Coming of Age” is a term that many UU churches have used to describe the transition that young people make as they move from childhood into adolescence. Other religious groups such as Catholics and Christians acknowledge this Rite of Passage with the sacrament of Confirmation while the Jewish Faith celebrate Bar and Bat Mitzvah during this time in a young person’s life. “Growing up” can be a long and complicated, as well as exciting journey and so, we have created a program that we intend will provide our youth with a community of friends and particular experiences that will enable them to make choices about how THEY want to “grow up”. It is an opportunity for them to find out more about themselves, their gifts, their strengths and their challenges.

Some of our hopes for this program are:

- Increasing self-confidence in our youth, knowing that their feelings are valid and that both they and their opinions matter.
- Know that each youth has a unique purpose that can only be defined by them.
- Understand that they have an important role in their family, at UUMAN, and in the larger community.
- Understand the changes that they are moving through as they are growing up.
- Know that they are not alone and that there are others who can support, help them and learn from them along the way.
- Take responsibility for them selves and accept the consequences of their decisions.
- Develop a personal value system and over the course of this year evolve their own dynamic Faith Statement.

In addition, each youth will be paired with a mentor from our church family to travel with them on this journey. The mentors will sometimes join us in class and will work together with the youth to talk about the “big questions” in life, design a service project, write faith statements, get to know each other and have a lot of fun.

**All of this will end with a final celebration and community recognition in May.**



We still have openings for men mentors who are feeling called to share their own unique gifts, life experiences and faith journeys with our youth. The feedback we have gotten from past mentors has been one of gratitude for the gifts and experience of working and learning together with our young church family members.

We are also still in need of one female facilitator to travel with us on this journey. The current dedicated facilitators also engaging in this adventure with our youth and me are Bruce Langston and Arnie Barnes Schwartz.
